

money to buy a toothbrush, let alone a pair of glasses."

To remedy this problem, one of the things the medical team provides is a device called a focometer, originally developed by NASA to help astronauts see better in space. For eye doctors, it gives them a practical way to acquire a patient's eye prescription so they can order glasses for them. Last year they passed out over 600 pairs of glasses alone.

Ultimately, Dr. McCord says that helping the less fortunate in Guatemala has been a very rewarding experience in that his team is able to cure a lot of people and provide medical care that they would not be able to receive oth erwise. In many cases, the trip even re-energizes the medical team's commitment to their patients back home.

"It is a poor country (Guatemala) and people that live in the mountains are either afraid or can't afford to travel to the big city to get health care," he said. "There is a public health care system, but they don't have enough money or doctors."

People can contribute to University United Methodist's medical missionary efforts through monetary donations to either the church or HELPS International for the stoves project or their secondary Guatemalan team heading to Uspantan.

The church is still looking for people with medical skills to volunteer for next year's Guatemala trip. Donations are also welcome from those with access to medicines and surgical or sterile supplies. The team will be leaving on July 15 and returning July 27. Somos Una Tradición Familiar

As the jury read its verdict Friday, Kearns-DeWalt stood with a blank expression. Her lip quivered slightly when she realized she had not been granted probation as she and her family had hoped. Her father, Edward Kearns, said he was "devastated" by the verdict.

Kearns DeWalt has served eight months of her sentence and will be eligible for parole in two years. The jury could have

given her life.

Edward Kearns said the family is resolved to appeal the case. "This isn't over There has been so much reversible error," he said. Both he and his late wife served time in jail for aiding and abetting the kidnapping.

The DeWalt family said they were pleased with the verdict. "Justice was served," said Mike DeWalt, who attended the trial

in his Navy uniform.

"It says a message," said De-Walt's mother, Char DeWalt. Other parents are going to hink twice before they do somehing like this. We don't want nother little boy to go through what Jeremy went through.'

In the sentencing phase of the rial, the 'prosecution tried to ortray Kearns-DeWalt as a psyhologically imbalanced, maniplative mother and ex-wife who abuse in an effort to gain full custody of her son.

The defense sought to show that regardless of whether or not Jeremy's father molested him, Kearns-DeWalt had good reason to believe he had, and made the fatal but understandable mistake of escaping with her son when she faced losing him to his father.

In the sentencing phase of the trial, the jury heard the details of the abuse claims for the first

Both the prosecution and the defense showed the jury a series of heart-wrenching videos depicting young Jeremy, who reportedly came back from the trip with his father with a stutter he didn't have before, describing horrible acts of sexual abuse that allegedly occurred on that trip. Both the FBI and the Navy investigated those claims but no charges were brought. Mike DeWalt denied the claims and reportedly passed multiple polygraph tests.

Jeremy, now 9, lives with his father at an unknown location. Kearns-DeWalt, along members of her family, have been barred from seeing him. He did not testify at the trial.
