Four CHRISTUS Santa Rosa nurses join exclusive group

SAN ANTONIO – Four nurses with CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Health Care recently gained a distinction that only a select few nurses across the country have received. Representatives of the non-profit DAISY (Diseases Attacking the Immune System) Foundation, which funds research to find a cure for diseases of the immune system, presented the nurses with the DAISY Award for Extraordinary Nurses to recognize the quality of their work in critical care areas. As of this spring, fewer than 500 nurses across the country have received this award.

The nurses who were recognized included Joanne Wyckoff, RN, of the Mother-Baby Unit at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa-City Centre; Michelle Snyder, RN, of Rehabilitation Services at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa-Medical Center; and Theresa Martinez, RN, of the Neo-natal Intensive Care Unit at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Children's Hospital; Irma Guardiola, RN, of Special Medicine at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Children's Hospital. As part of the award, each nurse received a hand-carved, stone sculpture, entitled "A Healer's Touch." Each sculpture was hand-carved by a sculptor of the Shona tribe of the African nation of Zimbabwe.

"We are so honored to have nurses of this caliber at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa," said Don A. Beeler, FACHE, president and CEO of CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Health Care. "The expertise and level of care they provide are

reflective of the overall quality found throughout our entire system."

Bonnie and Mark Barnes founded the DAISY Foundation in January 2000, after their son, J. Patrick, died at the age of 33 from complications from Idiopathic Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP), which is an auto-immune disease. A year later, they created the DAISY Award for Extraordinary Nurses in appreciation of the care that their son had received during his battle.

April 2005 marks the first anniversary of CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Health Care's involvement with the DAISY Foundation's Appreciation Program. During the past 12 months, the Foundation has honored more than a dozen nurses from the CHRISTUS Santa Rosa system. The DAISY Foundation also conducts its Appreciation Program in more than 30 major hospitals across the country. Foundation representatives indicated that they hoped the Appreciation Program, and similar efforts to recognize the work of nurses, would help increase nurse retention rates and help combat the ongoing nursing shortage in the U.S.

The DAISY Foundation's mission goes beyond honoring nurses and raising funds for research. The organization provides support to families who are dealing with the impact of immune system diseases and actively encourages blood and bone marrow donations because of the critical role they play in fighting immune system disorders.



Tips to follow to avoid having an identity crisis

Throughout her years with Frost Investment Services, vice president Nancy L. Thomas has heard her fair share of horror stories when it comes to identity theft.


On Tuesday afternoon, Thomas presented "When Bad Things Happen to Good People" at the UTSA's Durango Building to help participants avoid becoming a statistic when it comes to identity fraud.

According to CBS News every 79 seconds, a thief steals someone's identity, opens accounts in the victim's name and goes on a buying spree.

Here are a few tips, Thomas says, that can keep you from having to experience this crime:

Mail
Leave your mail for the postal carrier at a secure location. Purchase a mailbox that has a lock or security device. Rent a mailbox at the post office. "The mail monsters are looking for those people who are vulnerable," Thomas said. "There is a lot of personal information you have in the mail."

Trash
Make sure to shred personal documents before throwing them away. "Dumpster divers" will literally dig through trashcans to find personal information such as social security and account numbers. Purchase a quality shredder at an office supply store to destroy sensitive information that

to be maintained like a driver's license or a credit card for emergencies, but the 10 credit cards that someone may own don't have to be carried around. Keep them in a secure place at the home or office. Make copies of all your credit cards and keep that information stored away just in case someone steals your purse or wallet.

Computer

Don't send personal information to companies that send you e-mails, unless making the initiative to contact the company first. E-mails are not encrypted so once a sender pushes "Send" anyone can intercept that e-mail and steal your information. If doing online shopping, make sure the Web site you are inputting your credit card information into is a secured site.

What if?

What if you become a victim of identity fraud? First, close all your credit card accounts. Second, contact the credit bureau, postmaster (if the fraud involved mail), Federal Trade Commission and Social Security Administration and let them know what has happened. Also, make a police report by calling the non-emergency number.

Wallets and purses

Be careful what is carried in a wallet and purse during the day. Of course, there is information that needs
