KELLY's RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD TO MEET

KELLY AIR FORCE BASE, Texas – Kelly AFB's Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) will meet Monday, July 28, 1997, from 6 to 9:00 p.m. at Dwight Middle School on Southcross. The RAB will discuss issues related to the cleanup of the soil and groundwater, which is currently underway at the base.

A variety of topics will be discussed including RAB member training, and subcommittee reports.

Kelly officials created the Restoration Advisory Board in 1994 to provide more community input into the environmental cleanup of Kelly AFB. Members include local residents, community activists, environmental regulators and local government representatives. The board is co-chaired by an Air Force representative— Mr. Edward Riojas, San Antonio Air Logistics Center Executive Director and Ms. Annalisa Pease, a community representative. All RAB meetings are open to the public.

The RAB brings community members, a representative from the base, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), state agencies, and local governments together to work toward a common goal. The Air Force hopes that this kind of partnership approach will result in environmental decisions that meet the needs of the community and the Air Force.
