Air Force Transfers Former Myrtle Beach Air Force Base to Community

WHAT: The Air Force Real Property Agency (AFRPA) together with Myrtle Beach Air Force Base Redevelopment Authority will host partner agencies to commemorate the final property transfer at former Myrtle Beach Air Force Base and recognize over 50 years of Air Force history in South Carolina. Since base closure in 1993, 3,937 acres have been transferred to the Myrtle Beach Air Force Base Redevelopment Authority, Horry County, the City of Myrtle Beach and several other organizations. Although the Air Force will no longer be a landowner at Myrtle Beach, it will be actively involved for years to come to complete the environmental cleanup.
