MAP officially started in 2000 with only one employee to handle all cases, and has since grown to a 17-member department that negotiates free medicines from pharmaceutical companies before passing the savings to the patients. Over the years, it has generated tens of thousands of dollars for almost 20,000 needy patients yearly who can obtain their medications free or at a discount price through low-income Healthcare programs such as CareLink.

CareLink enrolls people who are essentially below 200 percent of the poverty level and normally don't have any other way to get their medicines, except through generous contributions from drug companies.

One such beneficiary is 63-year-old Angela Giroux, who had to rely on the MAP program benefits after suffering from a heart attack three-and-a-half years ago. In addition to the needed medication, she also

found a courteous, friendly staff that made her recovery period a lot smoother. And with the rising medical insurance, programs like MAP are even more appreciated.

"It is expensive to have regular medical insurance, especially when you are living on a fixed income," she said.

"These companies are making an enormous contribution in terms of money and health," added Dr. Robert Jiménez, chairman of the University Health System Board of Managers. "But in reality we can not add up the real value of what they are giving away. What they are doing for our patients is priceless."

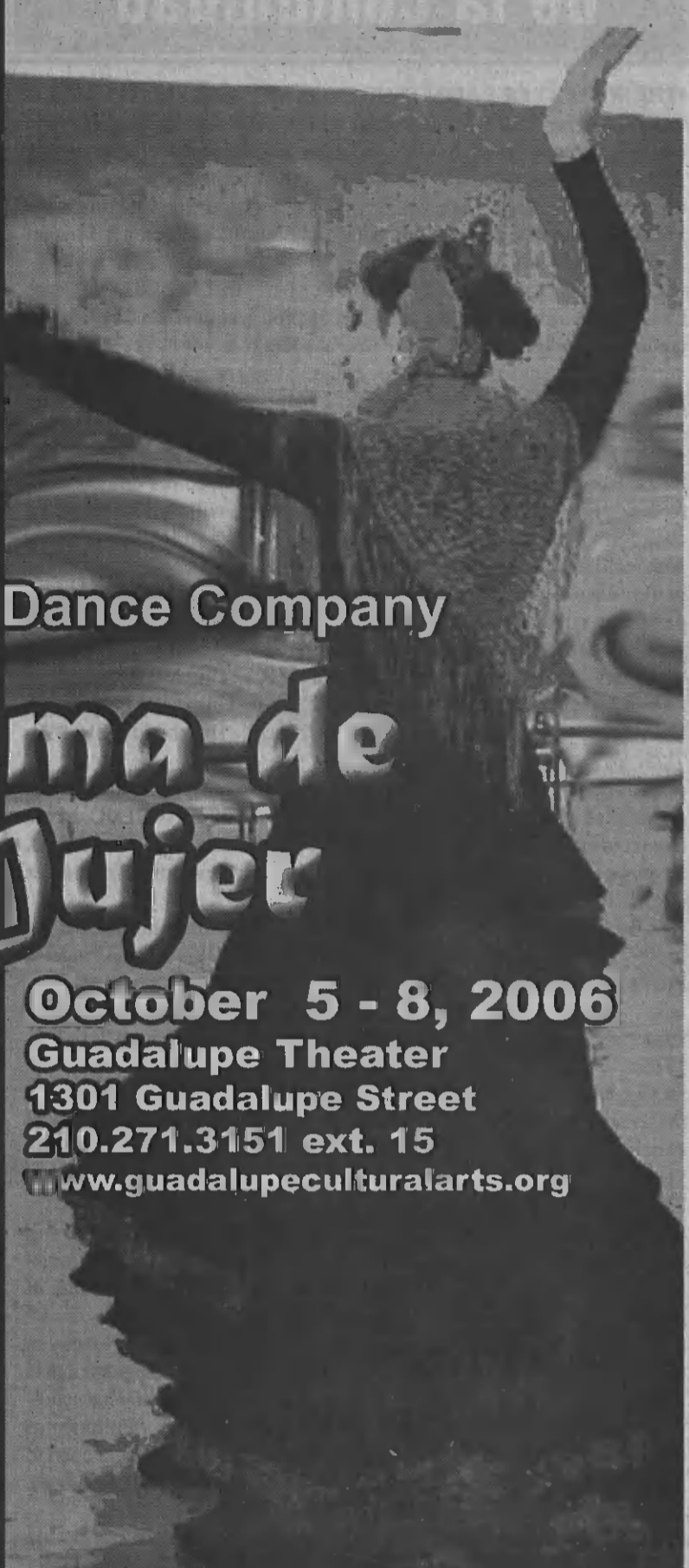

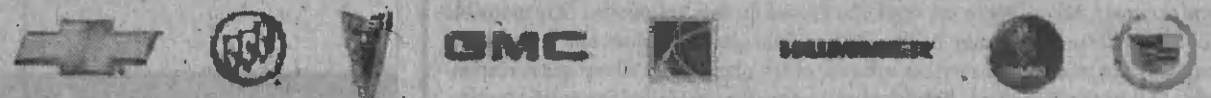
