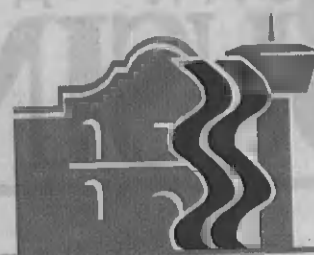

Substance abuse treatment

U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary Tommy Thompson released \$2 million in grants to the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio to support substance abuse treatment to teenagers released from prison.

In all, the government's Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration awarded \$23.3 million to 12 programs nationwide.

The university will receive \$500,000 per year over the next four years. Project STAY will work collaboratively with local community agencies to serve 240 previously incarcerated, minority youth aged 14-17.

These young people will receive outpatient substance abuse treatment.

Corporate expansion

For the second year in a row, Texas has been ranked the No. 2 state in the country for corporations looking to expand or relocate their operations, according to a survey by Plants Sites & Parks magazine.

North Carolina is the top state for expanding businesses, followed by Texas, Virginia, South Carolina, Tennessee, Arizona, California, Nevada, Ohio and Colorado. That's based on a poll by corporate executives looking to expand or relocate.

Executives ranked the states by such variables as the availability and quality of work force; access to transportation resources; general costs; location/logistics/market access; taxes and cooperation from state and local governments.

"Our readers are consultants and senior managers at companies considering expansion or relocation projects," says Managing Editor Lisa M. Bouchey. "Over the past few years, our readers' poll has been fairly accurate in predicting where business activity will increase."

Meanwhile, Texas ranked eighth on the magazine's Bizsites survey, which measures levels of corporate investment in

each state.

States were ranked by the number of project announcements recorded in the magazine's database over the last year.

Plants Sites & Parks listed a project if it created at least 20 new jobs, had a capital investment of at least \$1 million or added at least 20,000 square feet of space.

"It's no surprise that the southern states continue to be popular locations for investment," says associate editor Margaret Talley-Seijn. "Generally speaking, these states have lower costs of doing business."

In recent years, southern states have been working to improve transportation and education, making them more attractive to business development.

These states also have been aggressively marketing themselves and offering firms lucrative incentive packages, Talley-Seijn says.


