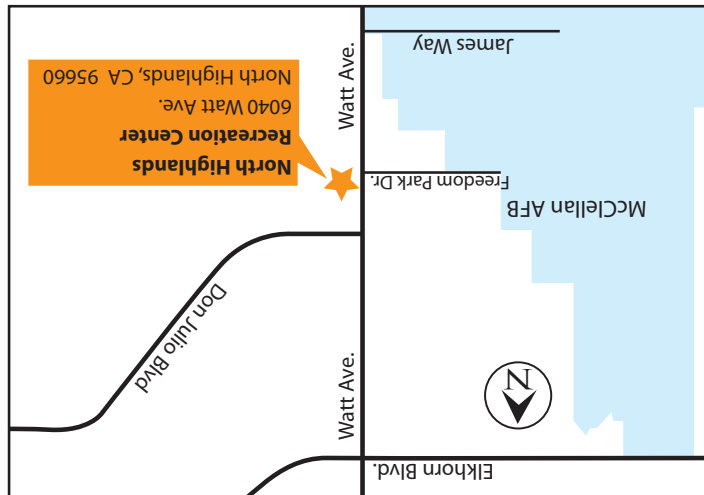

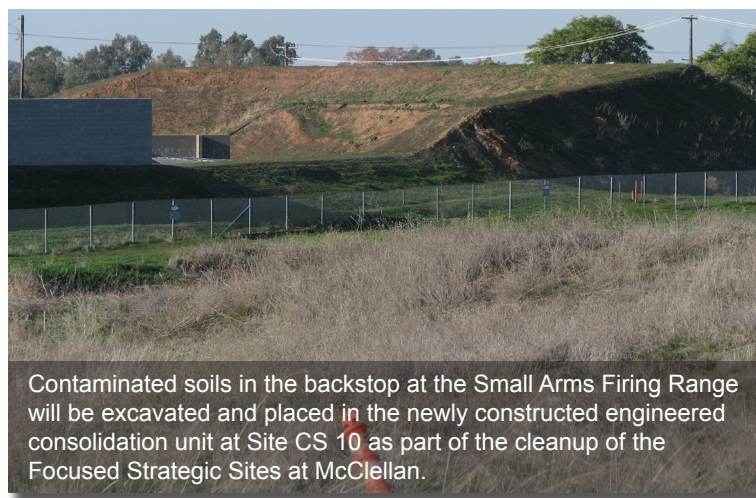
Focused Strategic Sites cleanup to begin this fall

Cleanup of the Focused Strategic Sites at McClellan is set to begin this fall. These sites include nine large waste disposal pits, a fire training area, and a small arms firing range.

“We call these ‘strategic sites’ because they contain some of our largest soil volumes and drive the most significant costs for the cleanup program here at McClellan,” said Steve Mayer, Air Force remediation program manager for McClellan.

In April 2012, the Air Force and regulatory agencies approved the Record of Decision, which details the selected remedy for contaminants at the sites. In August, the Air Force, through a competitive bidding process, selected URS Corp. to design and implement the specified remedy, which includes excavation of some sites, constructing an engineered consolidation unit at Site CS 10 to safely hold soils from other sites, and capping some sites.

Fieldwork for all sites except CS 10 is expected to be completed by 2015. The consolidation unit at CS 10 will be an engineered waste disposal area for McClellan. The current pit will be expanded and a leachate collection system and two layers of protective liners will be installed before accepting soils. The CU is scheduled to remain open

through 2019 to accept soils from other McClellan sites before the final protective cap is installed. Follow-up long-term monitoring and maintenance will be required.

URS is no stranger to the McClellan cleanup program. They led the excavation of the landfill at CS-10 and have conducted the ongoing maintenance and monitoring of that site and the cap at the northwest corner of the former base. In addition, they hold the contract for the groundwater cleanup program including operation and maintenance of the groundwater treatment systems and the soil vapor extraction systems.

“We’re pleased to have URS leading this major cleanup effort at McClellan. We’re looking forward to working with them to see these sites cleaned and ready for productive reuse for the community,” Mayer said.
