





PFAS RI Update





Remedial Investigation began in July 2021

- Collected groundwater samples from 96 existing monitoring wells
- Completed 245 soil borings to top of water table (1,151 samples)
- Completed 51 VAS locations (323 samples)
- Completed 13 HPT locations to the top of the clay layer
- Collected 4 seep samples
- Resumed RI fieldwork on 4 April 2022
 - Continuing VAS sampling
 - Install monitoring wells
 - Update CSM

VAS – vertical aquifer sampling; HPT – hydraulic profiling tool; CSM – conceptual site model



PFAS FT002 at Clark's Marsh IRA





 Site work began October 2021, as the site was graded and prepared for construction

- Tote building, expansion foundations and structure are complete
- Mechanical and electrical systems being installed
- Conveyance piping has been installed to extraction well locations
- Extraction wells to be installed in June 2022





PFAS Van Etten Lake at Ken Ratliff Memorial Park IRA Update





- Filter press optimization began 1 March 2022
- Building expansion, well control building foundation, and structures are complete
- Carbon tanks were received and installed
- Equipment is being installed as received
- Extraction wells to be installed in July/August 2022




