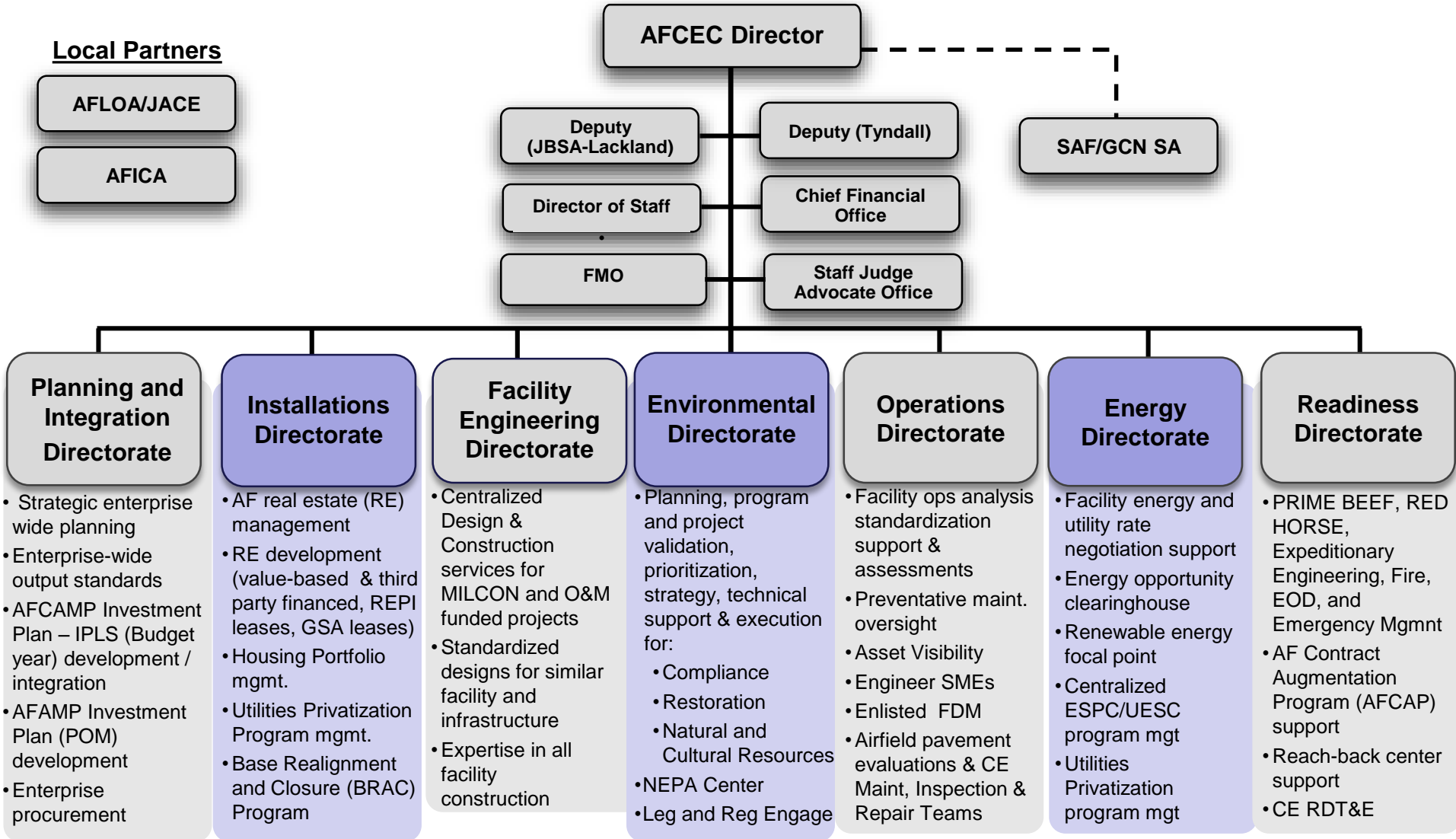

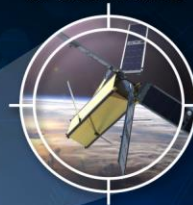

CURRENT STATE

Lack of CE ICS Asset Visibility

- Ineffective resource management (e.g., manpower, equipment, funding requirements)
- Inability to efficiently assess condition and energy consumption of assets

Lack of Standardization

- Disparate CE ICS that cannot be effectively managed
- Lack of secure data integration and visibility

Vulnerable to Cyber-Attacks

- Disruption/failure of Air Force mission operations

Non-Compliance with LRPs

- DODI 8510.01, *RMF for DOD IT*
- DODI 8500.01, *Cybersecurity*

Decentralized CE ICS

- Acquisition, management, security, maintenance, sustainment, and operation

Enterprise-Wide, Integrated ICS Asset Visibility and Reporting

- Automated collection and reporting of ICS data
- Integrated data from diverse and disparate ICS

Standardization of ICS

- Standardized ICS equipment, interfaces, processes, and contracts

ICS Security Risk Mitigation

- Continuously monitored networks → increased resiliency against cyber-attacks and non-malicious events

Enterprise-Wide ICS Planning

- Centrally managed resources
- Data-driven decision-making

- Effectively managed performance and health of ICS networks
