The Fire Emergency Services Division of the Air Force Civil Engineer Center has earned more than **\$323 million in actual cost savings and cost avoidance** for the Air Force.

Here are some of the ways they did it!

Bulk Purchasing

Hazardous Materials (HazMat) Chemical Protective Suits

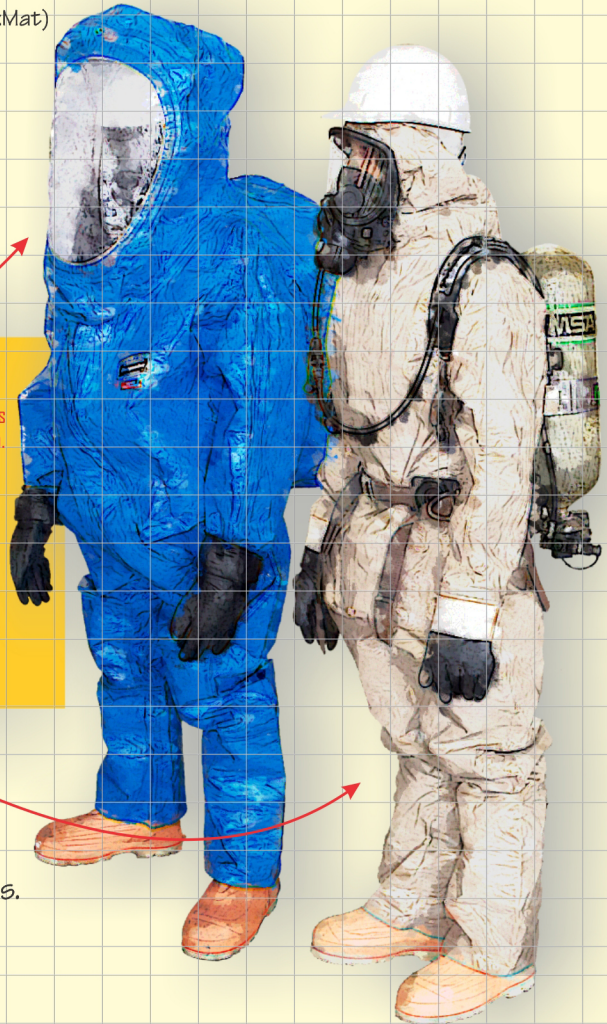
FES purchased and replaced 1,936 Level A and Level B HazMat emergency response suits that have reached the end of their service life.

Level A Chemical Vapor Protective Suit

Totally encapsulating vapor-protective ensemble provides the greatest level of skin, respiratory, and eye protection. This suit should be worn when the hazard cannot be determined or is identified as immediately dangerous to life and health.

Level B Chemical Liquid Protective Suit

The garment portion of a chemical-protective clothing ensemble that is designed and configured to protect the wearer against chemical liquid splashes but not against chemical vapors or gases.



\$AVING\$:

Using a centralized procurement approach, the Air Force gained a 43% cost-avoidance savings.

Regular cost = \$3,879,434

Air Force cost = \$2,712,891

Total Air Force cost-avoidance savings is \$1,166,543!
